Mr. Gagliardi previously successfully argued before the Appellate Division that a municipality is justified in refusing to produce a log of its police chief's e-mails in response to a request under the Open Public Records Act.

Attorneys for Galloway Township and NJSACOP argue that a reversal of the appellate decision would tax small local governments with cumbersome requests for logs of digital records.
